1. Event info

Event name: GCE Symposium [Turning Challenges into Opportunities] - UK

Event date: 29th August 2022

Hosting organization: CIVIC Computing Limited

The UK Rural GCE promotional event took place at The Dome (Charlotte Suite) in Edinburgh on 29th August 2022. The event attracted 16 participants.

The aim of the event was to disseminate the project's outputs and outreach more people that belong to the project's target groups. In addition, the event intended to present the Rural GCE training platform and its useful materials. The participants were reached through two sessions and all of them provided their feedback, not only through the brief questionnaire provided (in printed version) but also orally during the session provided for discussion, questions and networking.

The profile of people varied, emphasizing mainly on people living on rural areas or with strong network connections in rural areas. After being informed about the project, its results and the main learning platform, the participants had the opportunity to share their opinion in regards to the project's structure, topics and aims.

Through oral comments and written evaluation, the following conclusions were received:

- ✓ Great and important addition to have free access to the content online (through the LME platform) in the partner languages.
- ✓ The main concept of the project was very interesting.

The participants, after the end of the event, were kindly requested to give their feedback by answering a questionnaire. All participants responded by completing the questionnaire. The questionnaire is attached to the end of this report.

The questionnaire was intentionally kept short and included:

- 12 score sorting questions. The respondents were expected to check one unique number to each question from one to five, where 5 is the highest grade.
- 1 Open-Ended Question, where the respondents could answer in a free form with little to no restrictions.

This report contains the responses received from the Rural GCE event survey.


2. Score sorting questions

Participants gave their feedback on the Rural GCE promotional event by answering 12 score sorting questions. The questions were answered by checking one unique number from one to four, where 1 is the highest grade.

For convenience the sort scoring questions are:

- 1.1. The event met my expectations.
- 1.2. I found event content appropriate and adequate.
- 1.3. The activities were related to the aims and objectives of the event.
- 1.4. The event activities (seminar, network, interactions, etc...) were relevant and well-balanced.
- 1.5 The event duration was in relation to contents/subjects tackled.
- 1.6. I am satisfied with the presentation made by the speakers and/or trainers and/or workshop leaders.
- 2.1. The agenda prepared for the event was suitable.
- 2.2. The material was pertinent, clear and exhaustive.
- 2.3. The duration of the event was suitable.
- 2.4. Work undertaken during the event was in line with my expectations.
- 2.5. The venue chosen for the event was suitable.
- 2.6. I am satisfied with the organisation of my participation to the event.

3. Open-Ended Question

To help collect qualitative data the questionnaire also included one open type question, where the respondent could answer in a free form with little to no restrictions.

Participants had to answer the question: "Do you have any additional comments regarding the event?", the answers were as follows:

- More time needed to dive into the training modules.

- More information (relevant links) send by email would be appreciated.
- The project fills a learning gap.
